

M-SIG – Membership Eligibility

Guidance on eligibility for joining the Measurement SIG:

- Any InstMC members who register an interest.
- Membership requests (from those not members of the Institute), which are approved by the Chair of either the Steering Board or any affiliated Working Group.
- Invitees which accept their invitation to join. Invitations can be issued by the Chair of either the Steering Board or any affiliated Working Group.

The M-SIG membership is defined as a mailing list maintained by the Institute.
This supports the Operating Guidelines (but does not supersede any changes there within).

M-SIG Steering Board – Membership Eligibility

Guidance on eligibility for joining the M-SIG Steering Board:

- Accepted Members will normally be drawn from the M-SIG community.
- The maximum size of the Working Group will be set in the Operating Guidelines.
- Membership of the Steering Board is to be balanced to ensure that a broad range of measurement relevant industries, sectors and other key stakeholder types are represented, and the following shall be considered:
 - The candidate adds relevant skills, knowledge and links to the SB
 - Whether the SB is evenly represented by those in academia, industry, industry bodies, government etc.
 - The candidate adds to individual diversity
 - The candidate adds to the geographical spread
 - The candidate has suitable time availability and commitment
- Members may be invited by the Chair, and approved by a majority decision of the SB members.
- Members attend as individuals, not representing a company.

This supports the Operating Guidelines (but does not supersede any changes there within).

M-SIG Working Group – Membership Eligibility

Eligibility criteria for joining an M-SIG Working Group are:

- Accepted Members will normally be drawn from the M-SIG community.
- The maximum size of the Working Group will be set by the Chair (and account for practical considerations).
- Membership of the Working Groups is to be drawn from a wide spectrum of interested stakeholders, and is expected to continually represent a broad range of interests in the specified subject matter, and the following shall be considered:
 - The candidate adds relevant skills, knowledge and links to the WG
 - Whether the WG is evenly represented by those in academia, industry, industry bodies, government etc.
 - The candidate adds to individual diversity
 - The candidate adds to the geographical spread
 - The candidate has suitable time availability and commitment
- Members may be invited or submit personal application to the respective Chair. Members will be approved either by the Chair, or a majority vote of the present WG members (at the Chair's discretion). If appropriate, additional members may be included as "corresponding members" of each Working Group.
- Members attend as individuals, not representing a company.
